Estimados partidarios de SPIN,

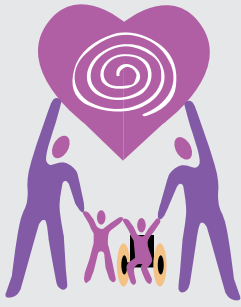

All Children with Disabilities Are Entitled to a Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE)

When Congress reauthorized IDEA 2004, they maintained the child’s right to a free appropriate public education (FAPE). The law requires the state to have policies and procedures to ensure that a free appropriate public education (FAPE) is available to all children with disabilities.

Educational Options for Special Needs Students

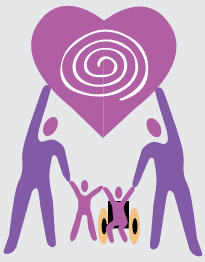
