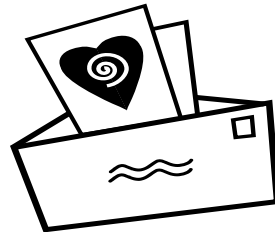

Our children are another year older (we are too!) and we are looking for some fun activities to keep them occupied and happy in the months to come. Please check out our calendar of events to see a few things that are happening around our county, and don't forget to look at your local Parks and Rec calendars too. They will make an accommodation for your child if they can, if you register and call ahead.

Planning ahead just seems to be the name of the game. The future becomes the present so swiftly!! Though we may be faced with the continual grieving when our child with special needs enters a new stage of life, we must continue to plan for the transitions between playgroup and preschool, between preschool and kindergarten, K-6 and middle school, middle school and high school, and then on to post-secondary school, or out into the world of work or a day program—and, of course, recreation and socialization opportunities. In our world of financial uncertainty and precarious funding of social service programs and education, it becomes even more important to plan for the future even if it is just a few months ahead or a few years. Learn all you can about the resources available for your child, and keep up with the current legislation and budget news in your school district and town. Make sure your local and state decision-makers are aware of how their funding decisions will affect your child and your family. Plan your financial future now. It is the most important work you will ever do.

Planificar por adelantado parece ser el nombre del juego. El futuro llega a ser el presente muy rápidamente!! ## PLANNING TIPS FROM A PARENT

by **Mary Lee Kinney**, Mother of Breanden Kinney, who has Down Syndrome.

Everyone's child has different capabilities, but planning for that day when your child leaves your home, or continues to live with you beyond age 18, should include teaching him or her basic life skills. Here are some suggestions for helping children with special needs successfully transition into the adult world:

- Teach them to clean their room and/or the house, including the dishes, vacuum, make and change their own bed; dust the furniture, take out the trash.
- Teach them to do laundry and put their own clothes away.
- Help them learn how to cook simple meals. Try the microwave first.
- If they are capable, help them find a job, even if it does not pay very much – they should at least try it. Go and observe a work site first. Some jobs are funded by the San Andreas Regional Center if your child has developmental disabilities.
- Help them discover a recreational activity that they like and can spend free time doing with friends.

Cada niño tiene diferentes capacidades, pero es bueno planificar para el día cuando su niño se vaya de la casa, o continúe viviendo con usted, debe de incluir enseñarle a él o ella sus destrezas básicas de la vida. Aquí están algunas indicaciones para ayudar a su niño con necesidades especiales a tener una transición dentro del mundo adulto:

- Enseñarles a limpiar su cuarto y/o la casa, incluyendo los trastes, aspirar, y cambiar su cama; sacudir los muebles, sacar la basura para afuera.
- Enseñarle a lavar su ropa y guardar su ropa
- Ayúdeles a aprender como cocinar comidas simples. Intente el microondas primero.
- Si ellos están capacitados, ayúdelos a encontrar un empleo, no importa el salario. Por lo menos deben intentarlo. Algunos trabajos son fundados por el Centro de San Andreas Regional si su niño tiene incapacidades de desarrollo.
- Ayúdelos a descubrir una actividad recreacional que a ellos les guste y puedan pasar tiempo libre haciendo con sus amigos.
